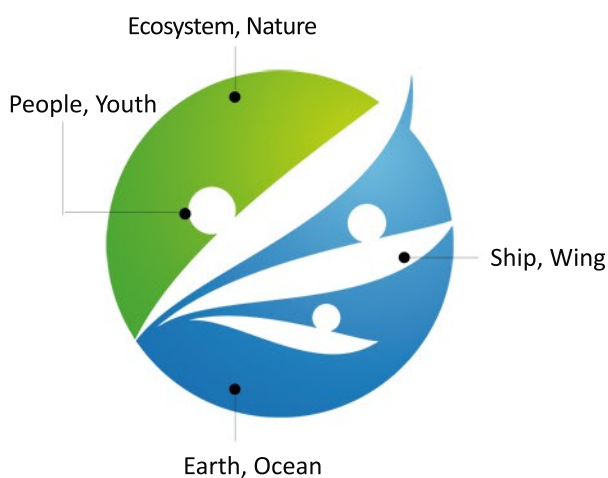

International Youth Exchange Organization of Japan, abbreviated to IYEO, is a voluntary organization formed by people who mainly participated in the International Youth Exchange Program hosted by Cabinet Office, Government of Japan started in 1959. IYEO was established with the aim of developing and strengthening international exchange activities in the local areas. There are its voluntary groups in all 47 prefectures, and they implement various activities. The number of IYEO members is approximately 10,000.

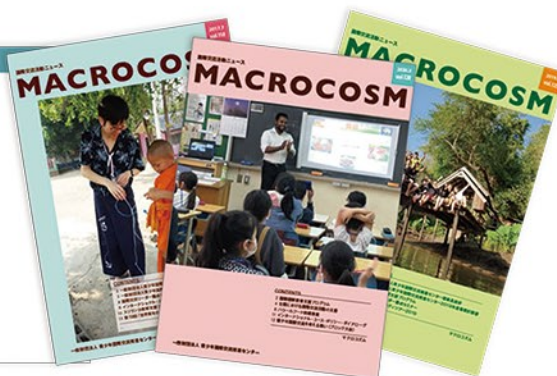

### The Cabinet Office, Government of Japan

Commissioned by the Cabinet Office, Government of Japan we have carried out the International Youth Exchange Programs. The programs are composed of the International Youth Development Exchange Program, the Ship for Southeast Asian and Japanese Youth Program, Japan-China Youth Friendship Exchange Program, Japan-Korea Youth Friendship Exchange Program, and the Ship for World Youth Program.

## Statistical Information Institute for Consulting and Analysis

The Statistical Information Institute for Consulting and Analysis, abbreviated to Sinfonica, hosts the programs with the aim of human resource development in the field of official statistics in the countries of Africa and Asia since 2022.



Statistical officials in Africa and Asia visit Japan and receive lectures in Tokyo and other areas for 10 days to 3 weeks.



Since 2024, in collaboration with Sinfonica, CENTERYE launched the Next Leader for Statistics and DX Exchange Program 2024 (NextStatX2024) , aiming to contribute to the mutual development of Statistics and Digital Transformation (DX) fields between Republic of Latvia and Japan by inviting the youths from Republic of Latvia, where many IT start-ups grow up and DX field is advanced, to Japan and discussing and sharing efforts in Statistics, Data Science, and DX by both countries.

## Accumulation of Knowledge and Experience

Accumulated information, knowledge and networks through the preparation, planning, implementing and managing of various international exchange programs.



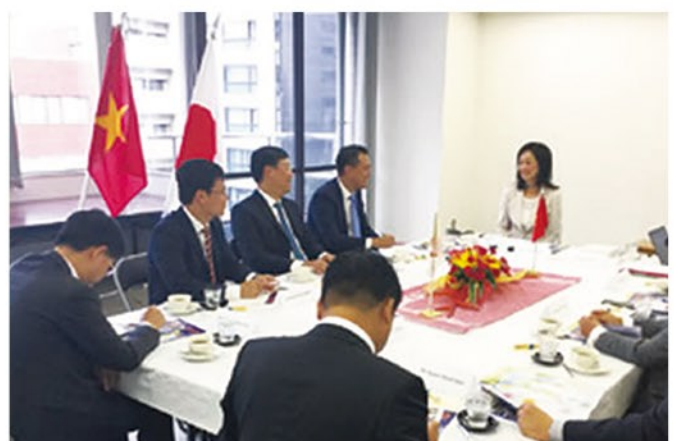

## 30 Years of Our History

Since its establishment in 1994, the Center for International Youth Exchange (CENTERYE) has, for 30 years, provided opportunities for young people to learn and grow through the implementation of international exchange programs in cooperation with the Cabinet Office of Japan, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the ASEAN-Japan Centre (AJC), and various private organizations.

Over the years, we have engaged with more than 25,000 young people from 107 countries and regions worldwide, dedicating our efforts to nurturing the next generation of leaders — a record that continues to sustain and inspire our activities.

Throughout these three decades, our international exchange programs have diversified in response to changing times and evolving social needs. By working hand in hand with partners both in Japan and abroad, we have shaped the path of our organization through steady, collaborative efforts.

- 1967 Launch of the “Ship for Youth” Program by the Prime Minister’s Office (now the Cabinet Office)
- 1968 Formation of the post-program alumni association “Ship for Youth Alumni Association”
- 1974 Launch of the “Ship for Southeast Asian Youth Program (SSEAYP)” by the Prime Minister’s Office (now the Cabinet Office)
- 1979 Launch of the Japan–China Youth Friendship Exchange Program by the Prime Minister’s Office (now the Cabinet Office)
- 1985 Integration of post-program organizations into the “International Exchange Youth Organization of Japan”
- 1987 Launch of the Japan–Korea Youth Friendship Exchange Program by the Management and Coordination Agency (now the Cabinet Office)
- 1988 Launch of the “Ship for World Youth Program (SWY)”

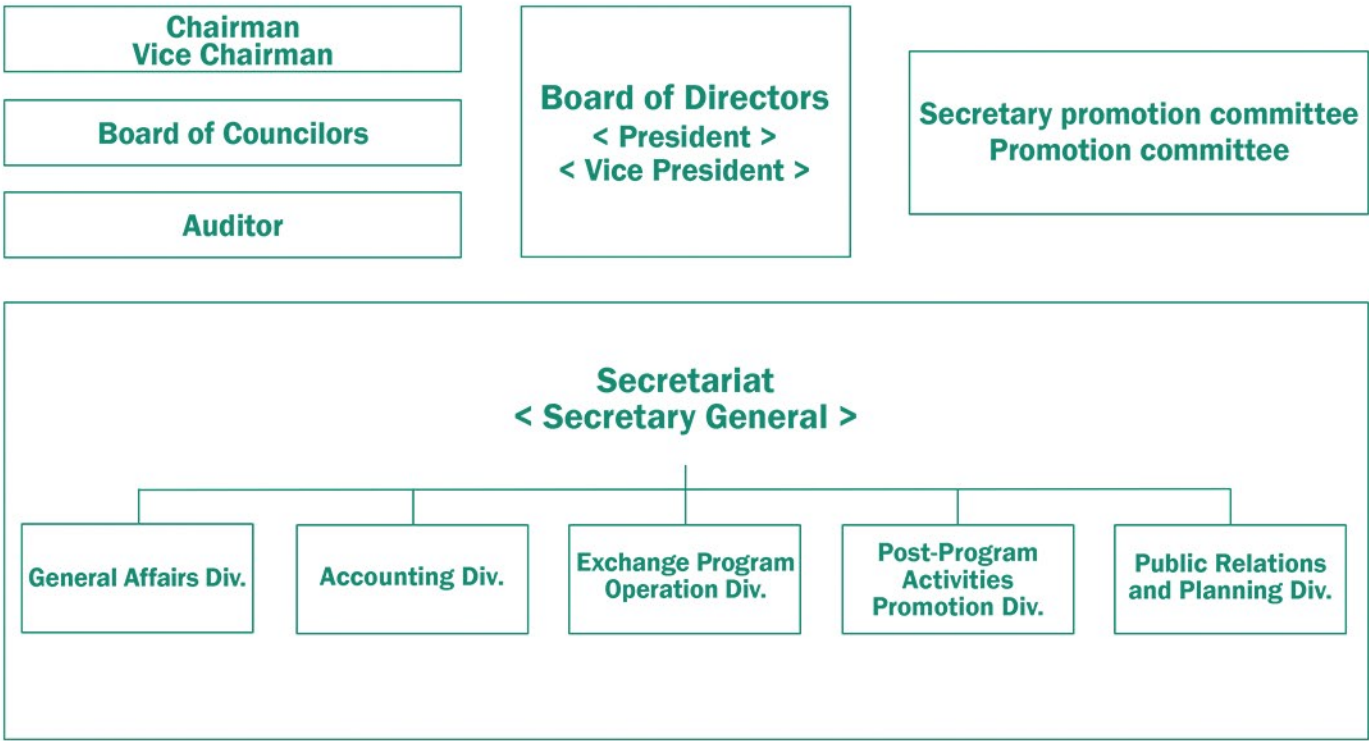
